FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

• The Library plans to offer at least four Affordable Learning Grants for successful faculty applicants who wish to replace their for-cost course materials with either OER or appropriately-licenses Library materials in one or more of their Fall 2023 courses. This year we have opened up eligibility to part-time faculty as well. Applications for Affordable Learning Grants are due Friday, April 28. We will host drop-in information sessions on Thursday, March 9, at 1 pm and Friday, March 10, at 11:30 am in WML 202.

GRADUATE STUDIES

- We currently have 476 graduate assistant applications ready for departmental review. This is up from 260 last year.
- More than 60 graduate students, mostly international students, attended the Super Bowl themed social held in February. Another social is being planned for April.

PLANNING & ACCREDITATION UPDATES

Strategic Plan: During the fall 2022 semester, the Office of Planning & Institutional Effectiveness updated the Strategic Plan progress update web site with additional outcomes, activities, and data from the spring 2002-fall 2022 period. This information was reviewed during intersession at a joint meeting of the President's Cabinet, University Planning Committee, and deans. The group discussed emerging areas of focus for the remaining lifespan of the plan along with suggestions to improve coordination/awareness across groups working on these and other goals, and to enhance the plan's visibility. Faculty are invited to share suggestions for additional activities that demonstrate support of the Strategic Plan with Kate Yerkes.

NSSE and other surveys: The Office coordinated reporting from last Spring's National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) survey, which was administered to all first year and senior students. We were very pleased with a 30% response rate. Summary reports from the core NSSE module, and two supplemental modules included this year (diversity and inclusion, and an AJCU-specific module on student experiences with elements of our Jesuit mission), are available on the <u>Strategic Plan</u> and <u>Institutional Survey Reports</u> web sites. NSSE data are being discussed by the University Planning Committee, deans, and other groups, and additional analysis is now underway to consider potential differences in responses across various demographic groups, and trends from prior NSSE administrations. Preliminary planning is underway to administer the Noel-Levitz Student Satisfaction (undergrad and grad students) and Institutional Priorities (faculty and staff) surveys in fall 2023.

Annual Planning & Reporting Cycle for Spring 2023: In early April, the Annual Planning and Reporting Cycle will open for academic department chairpersons and administrative department heads to prepare and submit summary of activities, including assessment results and their application, and reflection on their own DEI efforts, from the 2022-23 academic year. Preparers will also share departmental goals and other plans for 2023-2024, and budget and other resource requests for 2024-2025. The Annual Report is a vital resource documenting departmental, college, and divisional participation in planning and assessment, and support for the strategic plan.

Middle States Updates: Just a few weeks ago, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) moved forward with updates to its <u>Standards for Accreditation and Requirements of Affiliation</u>. Although this was not a comprehensive recrafting of the document, several important changes have been made, including the addition of language regarding institutions' responsibilities for diversity, equity, and inclusion in multiple standards, including Standard 6 (*Planning, Resources, and Institutional Improvement*) and Standard 7 (*Leadership, Governance, and Administration*).

Faculty are also reminded that any significant change to academic program offerings, including (but not limited to) potential new delivery modalities, locations, or partnerships, must be reviewed by the Office of Planning and Institutional Effectiveness to determine any MSCHE policy implications and potential approval and/or notification requirements. - The University of Scranton will host the HamSCI Workshop 2023, which engages amateur radio enthusiasts and professional scientists to collaborate on existing and future innovative research projects. The conference takes place March 17-18 at locations on campus and at the historic Lackawanna Station hotel. HamSCI is an officially recognized NASA Citizen Science project.
- The Library has initiated Open Access publishing agreements with Cambridge University Press and the American Chemical Society. The Library's OER Committee will host an Open Education Week (March 5th-10th) event to discuss the agreements and the new round of Affordable Learning Implementation grants.
- The Library and the English Department will co-host an Alumna Author event with Liz Alterman on March 30, 2023, at 5:00 pm in the Heritage Room. After a reading, Liz Alterman will discuss her journey to becoming an author and answer questions. The event is open to the community, Light refreshments will be served.
- The University of Scranton Archives is hosting an exhibit commemorating the 20th Anniversary of Rev. Scott R. Pilarz's first inauguration as President of The University of Scranton. The exhibit titled *Pride, Passion, Promise* will be on display in the Charles Kratz Scranton Heritage Room until April 23, 2023.
- The Weinberg Memorial Library is seeking submissions for our annual exhibit of Environmental Art. Submissions to the Environmental Art Show are open to all, and we encourage submissions by University of Scranton students, staff, faculty, and alumni. The deadline for all submissions is set for Wednesday, March 31st, 2023.
