All positions listed below are full time, nine-month, tenure track faculty positions and begin in August 2012. Academic rank and salary are commensurate with credentials and experience. College of Arts and Sciences

Chemistry: Organic Chemistry

Faculty position in Organic Chemistry with responsibilities for teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels, scholarship, and service. The successful candidate will design and teach courses in Organic Chemistry at the undergraduate levels. Qualifications: A PhD in Chemistry or related discipline is preferred, but ABD in Chemistry or related discipline will be considered.

College of Professional Studies

Counseling: Assistant Professor

Faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor for a Counselor Educator with a specialization in School Counseling. Responsibilities include graduate teaching in specialization and other core graduate and undergraduate courses as needed, research and publication, clinical supervision, and student mentoring. Required: earned doctorate in Counselor Education or a closely-related field; relevant experience as a professional school counselor; familiarity with the ASCA National Model, and previous teaching experience. Preferred: graduate of CACREP-accredited program; possession of, or eligibility for, additional credentials (NCC, CRC, LPC). Applicants must include a letter of interest, CV, and three letters of recommendation which directly address the applicant's competencies and potential in the areas specified above. Encouraged: undergraduate and graduate transcripts, reprints of representative publications, sample course evaluations.

Education: Reading Education, (K-12)

Faculty position in Reading Education K-12, with responsibilities in teaching, scholarship, and service. Qualifications: An earned doctorate in Reading Education or closely related discipline is preferred; an ABD in Reading Education or closely-related discipline with completion of doctorate by August 1, 2012 will be considered. Other preferred qualifications are: a clearly defined scholarly agenda, evidence of committed community and professional service, teaching experience in a university teacher education program, three (3) years of quality teaching experience in Reading Education in public or private school PreK-12 classrooms, and the ability to be certified in Reading Education (K-12).

Education: Education, Generalist, (PreK-8)

Faculty position as a generalist in Education, with responsibilities in teaching, scholarship, and service. The position will have a focus on preschool and elementary education. An earned doctorate in Education or related discipline is preferred, however an ABD in Education with doctorate completed by August 1, 2012 will be considered. Other preferred qualifications are teaching experience in a university teacher education program; minimum of three (3) years of quality teaching experience in public or private school PreK-8 classroom; the ability to be certified in PreK-8 teaching.

Exercise Science & Sport: Biomechanics/Applied Anatomy

Faculty position responsible for, but not limited to, teaching biomechanics and applied anatomy courses. Additional assigned courses may include other topics within the curriculum. Candidate should possess experience working with Codamotion Analysis System, Hawk Digital Real Time Camera System, Dartfish, Noraxon Telemyo Telemetry System, Noraxon MyoTrace 400, and Biopac MP 150 data Acquisition System. Experience with teaching undergraduate students in a cadaver lab setting is preferred. Qualifications: An earned doctorate in Exercise Science or an associated field is preferred, however ABD candidates with a doctorate by August 1, 2012 will be considered. Preference will be given to those candidates who have shown an evidence of scholarly research within the discipline.

Exercise Science & Sport: Nutrition

Faculty position responsible for, but not limited to, the teaching of beginner through advanced nutrition classes. Additional assigned courses may include other topics within the health field. Candidate will be expected to further develop the nutrition program including curriculum and program development. Qualifications: An earned doctorate in nutrition or an associated health field is preferred, however ABD candidates with a doctorate by August 1, 2012 will be considered. Candidate must also possess current Registered Dietitian certification. Preference will be given to those candidates who have shown an evidence of scholarly research in nutrition.

Occupational Therapy: Assistant Professor

Faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor in an accredited five-year Master of Science in Occupational Therapy program with responsibilities in teaching, scholarship, and service. Qualifications: An earned, non-clinical doctorate in Occupational Therapy or a related field; and eligibility for licensure as an Occupational Therapist in Pennsylvania. The preferred candidate will demonstrate clinical expertise, the ability to facilitate faculty-mentored student research and a record of teaching effectiveness

Accounting: Assistant Professor in Accounting Information Systems and Auditing

Faculty position in Accounting Information Systems & Auditing at the rank of assistant professor. Duties include teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels, scholarly research activities meeting AACSB-related criteria and service. Primary teaching responsibilities will be in the areas of accounting information systems and auditing. An ability to teach writing intensive and accounting communications courses is desirable. Qualifications: An earned doctorate in the appropriate field from an AACSB-accredited institution is preferred; ABD with completion expected within 18 months of appointment will also be considered. Management: Assistant Professor

Faculty position at the rank of assistant professor in Management. Duties include teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels, scholarly research activities meeting AACSB-related criteria, and service. The primary teaching responsibilities will be organization behavior, with an emphasis on multiculturalism and organizational power and politics. This position may also involve teaching in other areas of management. Qualifications: An earned doctorate in Management from an AACSB-credited institution is preferred; ABD with completion expected within 18 months of appointment will also be considered.
