First, thank you to all those who came to the Meet & Greet sessions on June 18<sup>th</sup>. I was quite impressed by the turnout but more so by the love you have for Scranton and how obvious and authentic it truly is. I am blessed to be here!

Angelo Joseph (A.J.) Rizzo S.J., '03, the incoming president of Scranton Prep, and Fr. Tom Neitzke S.J., the new dean of Arrupe College of Loyola Chicago University. Their election now will allow them to attend the September meeting and I am certain that both will make fine additions to our board.

Beyond the above, I have enjoyed quite a few meetings with administrators and staff, faculty who reached out to say hello, and a number of our benefactors.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Jeff Gingerich for a great job as acting president these past several months. I know from personal experience how challenging the role of a provost can be so to take on the responsibilities of president on top of that is really an act of great generosity. Thank you, Jeff.

I can't imagine the agony those families are enduring at this moment.
