

**General Guidelines and Information for Honors Tutorials**  
**at the University of Scranton**

- 1. Honors Tutorials are worth three academic credits and can be taken in either the fall or spring semesters, as well as January Intersession and Summer Sessions I and II in June and July. We strongly recommend submitting ALL paperwork for an Honors Tutorial the semester before you intend to take it. Tutorials will ONLY be accepted before the first week of a semester has concluded. DO NOT wait until the last minute.**
- 2. Professors can only teach two Honors Tutorials per semester. If two (2) students are in the same tutorial, that counts as two (2) tutorials for that professor.**
- 3. The designated numbers are Fall (385H, 387H), Spring (386H, 388H), Intersessions/Summers I & II (389H). For example, if a tutorial is being taught by a history professor in the Fall, it would be HIST 385H and one offered by a chemistry professor in the Spring it would be CHEM 388H.**
- 4. Only Tenured or Tenure-track professors can offer Honors Tutorials.**
- 5. All tutorials must have a research component of some kind, regardless of their subject material.**
- 6. Professors and Honors Students should meet on a regular basis through the entire semester, at least two meetings per month.**
- 7. Professors who are new to the university and/or have never offered an honors tutorial are highly encouraged to contact Dr. Sean Brennan, the Honors Program Director, as well as their colleagues who have offered previous tutorials.**

**8. Honors students must take three honors tutorials to graduate from the Honors Program, at least one inside their major, and one outside their major.**
