# INTEGRATION BEE ROUND ONE: DEFINITE INTEGRALS



All answers must be **simplified** which means

- Rational numbers must be simplified and reduced.

$$\frac{14}{2} \text{ X vs } 7 \text{ ✓}$$

$$\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{6} \text{ X vs } \frac{1}{2} \text{ ✓}$$

$$e^{\ln 2} \text{ X vs } 2 \text{ ✓}$$

$$\ln 1 \text{ X vs } 0 \text{ ✓}$$

- Trigonometric functions must be evaluated when possible.

$$\sin \frac{\pi}{3} \text{ X vs } \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} \text{ ✓}$$

$$\tan 0 \text{ X vs } 0 \text{ ✓}$$



# INTEGRATION BEE ROUND ONE: DEFINITE INTEGRALS



- You do **not** need to combine multiple logs or fractions with irrational numbers (e.g.  $\pi$ ,  $e$ ,  $\ln 3$ ).

$$2 \ln 3 \checkmark, \ln 9 \checkmark$$

$$\frac{1}{e} + 2 \checkmark, \frac{1 + 2e}{e} \checkmark$$

- However, **no** negative powers should remain.

$$e^{-1} \times \text{ vs } \frac{1}{e} \checkmark$$

## INTEGRAL #1

$$\int_0^4 x(5\sqrt{x} + 2) dx$$

## INTEGRAL #1

$$\int_0^4 x(5\sqrt{x} + 2) dx$$

$$= \int_0^4 (5x^{3/2} + 2x) dx$$

$$= [2x^{5/2} + x^2]_0^4$$

$$= 2 \cdot 2^5 + 2^4$$

$$= 144$$

## INTEGRAL #2

$$\int_{\pi/6}^{\pi/4} \sin(\pi - 2x) dx$$

## INTEGRAL #2

$$\begin{aligned} & \int_{\pi/6}^{\pi/4} \sin(\pi - 2x) dx \\ &= \left[ \frac{1}{2} \cos(\pi - 2x) \right]_{\pi/6}^{\pi/4} \\ &= \frac{1}{2} \left( \cos\left(\pi - \frac{\pi}{2}\right) - \cos\left(\pi - \frac{\pi}{3}\right) \right) \\ &= \frac{1}{2} \left( \cos \frac{\pi}{2} - \cos \frac{2\pi}{3} \right) \\ &= \boxed{\frac{1}{4}} \end{aligned}$$

### INTEGRAL #3

$$\int_0^2 x(x-1)(x+1) dx$$

### INTEGRAL #3

$$\int_0^2 x(x-1)(x+1) dx$$

$$= \int_0^2 (x^3 - x) dx$$

$$= \left[ \frac{x^4}{4} - \frac{x^2}{2} \right]_0^2$$

$$= \left[ \frac{16}{4} - \frac{4}{2} - 0 \right]$$

$$= \boxed{2}$$

$$\int_e^{e^9} \frac{1}{x \sqrt{\ln x}} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #4

$$\begin{aligned} & \int_e^{e^9} \frac{1}{x\sqrt{\ln x}} dx \\ &= \int_1^9 \frac{1}{\sqrt{u}} du \quad u = \ln x, \quad du = \frac{1}{x} dx \\ &= \int_1^9 u^{-\frac{1}{2}} = 2 \left[ u^{\frac{1}{2}} \right]_1^9 \\ &= 2[3 - 1] \\ &= \boxed{4} \end{aligned}$$

$$\int_0^{\pi/4} \frac{\sec x \tan x}{\cos x} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #5

$$\int_0^{\pi/4} \frac{\sec x \tan x}{\cos x} dx$$

$$= \int_0^{\pi/4} \sec^2 x \tan x dx$$

$$u = \tan x, \quad du = \sec^2 x dx$$

$$= \int_0^1 u du = \left[ \frac{1}{2} u^2 \right]_0^1$$

$$= \boxed{\frac{1}{2}}$$

**INTEGRAL #6**

$$\int_{-3}^{-1} \frac{1 - x^3}{4 + x - 4x^3 - x^4} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #6

$$\begin{aligned} & \int_{-3}^{-1} \frac{1-x^3}{4+x-4x^3-x^4} dx \\ &= \int_{-3}^{-1} \frac{1-x^3}{(4+x)(1-x^3)} dx \\ &= \int_{-3}^{-1} \frac{1}{4+x} dx \\ &= \left[ \ln|4+x| \right]_{-3}^{-1} = \ln 3 - \ln 1 \\ &= \boxed{\ln 3} \end{aligned}$$

$$\int_1^2 3x e^{3 \ln x^3 - 4 \ln x^2} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #7

$$\int_1^2 3xe^{3\ln x^3 - 4\ln x^2} dx$$

$$= \int_1^2 3xe^{\ln x^9 - \ln x^8} dx$$

$$= \int_1^2 3xe^{\ln x} dx = \int_1^2 3x^2 dx$$

$$= [x^3]_1^2$$

$$= 8 - 1 = \boxed{7}$$

$$\int_0^1 9x^2(1-x^3)^2 dx$$

## INTEGRAL #8

$$\int_0^1 9x^2(1-x^3)^2 dx$$

$$= -3 \int_1^0 u^2 du$$

$$u = 1 - x^3, \quad du = -3x^2 dx$$

$$= -3 \left[ \frac{u^3}{3} \right]_1^0$$

$$= -3 \left[ 0 - \frac{1}{3} \right]$$

$$= \boxed{1}$$

$$\int_{25}^{64} \frac{1}{2\sqrt{x}\sqrt{9-\sqrt{x}}} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #9

$$\int_{25}^{64} \frac{1}{2\sqrt{x}\sqrt{9-\sqrt{x}}} dx$$

$$= - \int_4^1 u^{-1/2} du$$

$$u = 9 - \sqrt{x}, \quad du = -\frac{dx}{2\sqrt{x}}$$

$$= -2 \left[ \sqrt{u} \right]_4^1$$

$$= -2[1 - 2] = \boxed{2}$$

$$\int_{-1}^1 (12x^3 + 6x^2 - x) dx$$

## INTEGRAL #10

$$\int_{-1}^1 (12x^3 + 6x^2 - x) dx$$

$$= \left[ 3x^4 + 2x^3 - \frac{1}{2}x^2 \right]_{-1}^1$$

$$= 3 + 2 - \frac{1}{2} - \left( 3 - 2 - \frac{1}{2} \right)$$

$$= \boxed{4}$$

$$\int_1^8 \frac{24}{\sqrt[3]{x^2}(\sqrt[3]{x} + 1)^3} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #11

$$\int_1^8 \frac{24}{\sqrt[3]{x^2}(\sqrt[3]{x} + 1)^3} dx$$

$$= 72 \int_2^3 u^{-3} du \quad u = \sqrt[3]{x} + 1, \quad du = \frac{x^{-2/3}}{3} dx$$

$$= -36 \left[ \frac{1}{u^2} \right]_2^3$$

$$= -36 \left( \frac{1}{9} - \frac{1}{4} \right)$$

$$= \boxed{5}$$

$$\int_{\pi/4}^{\pi/3} \sin x \cos x \tan x \cot x \sec x \csc x \, dx$$

## INTEGRAL #12

$$\int_{\pi/4}^{\pi/3} \sin x \cos x \tan x \cot x \sec x \csc x \, dx$$

$$= \int_{\pi/4}^{\pi/3} 1 \, dx$$

$$= \left[ x \right]_{\pi/4}^{\pi/3}$$

$$= \left[ \frac{\pi}{3} - \frac{\pi}{4} \right]$$

$$= \boxed{\frac{\pi}{12}}$$

INTEGRAL #13

$$\int_1^2 15x \sqrt{x-1} dx$$

## INTEGRAL #13

$$\int_1^2 15x\sqrt{x-1} dx$$

$$= 15 \int_0^1 (u+1)\sqrt{u} du \quad u = x-1, \quad x = u+1, \quad du = dx$$

$$= 15 \int_0^1 \left(u^{\frac{3}{2}} + u^{\frac{1}{2}}\right) du$$

$$= 15 \left[ \frac{2}{5}u^{\frac{5}{2}} + \frac{2}{3}u^{\frac{3}{2}} \right]_0^1 = 15 \left[ \frac{2}{5} + \frac{2}{3} \right] = 6 + 10$$

$$= 16$$

INTEGRAL #14

$$\int_{\frac{\pi}{6}}^{\pi} 6x \cos 6x \, dx$$

## INTEGRAL #14

$$\int_{\frac{\pi}{6}}^{\pi} 6x \cos 6x \, dx$$

$$= \left[ x \sin 6x \right]_{\pi/6}^{\pi} - \int_{\pi/6}^{\pi} \sin 6x \, dx$$

Integration by parts:

$$\begin{aligned} u &= 6x & dv &= \cos 6x \, dx \\ du &= 6 \, dx & v &= \frac{1}{6} \sin 6x \end{aligned}$$

$$= 0 - \int_{\pi/6}^{\pi} \sin 6x \, dx$$

$$= \frac{1}{6} \left[ \cos 6x \right]_{\pi/6}^{\pi}$$

$$= \frac{1}{6} [1 - (-1)] = \boxed{\frac{1}{3}}$$

$$\int_0^1 32e^2x^3 dx$$

## INTEGRAL #15

$$\int_0^1 32e^2x^3 dx$$

$$= 8e^2[x^4]_0^1$$

$$= 8e^2[1 - 0]$$

$$= 8e^2 = 8ee \approx \text{"B"}ee \quad :)$$
