STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATE

The 2020 <u>Strategic Plan</u> was constructed through a widely consultative process that included reflection on assessment; planning engagement at the departmental, college, and divisional levels; campus-wide surveys and fora; discussions with representative governance groups; and the continued work and careful discernment of the University Planning Committee (UPC) and President's Cabinet. Since its approval by the Board of Trustees in May 2020, the implementation of the plan has followed the same path, engaging a wide array of members of our campus community in ways both big and small.

As part of our integrated planning model, University departments, colleges, and other administrative areas take part in an annual planning cycle to articulate ways to support the plan through their own activities and collaborative initiatives. In addition to their fundamental use in formative planning, assessment, and resource discussions at each level, documents prepared in this this process are reviewed to identify & celebrate work done at each level in our annual strategic plan progress reporting. In addition, topical committees, including the DEI and Laudato Si steering committees, have been actively engaged in developing and guiding the implementation of focused strategies to address our needs and goals in each area, directly supporting corresponding Strategic Plan goals, and the broader directions of the Society of Jesus' Universal Apostolic Preferences and AJCU Characteristics of Jesuit Education. The www.scranton.edu/strategicplan website includes summary of activities and achievements across the five goals of the Strategic Plan, including key data and outcomes indicators.

As the current plan will wrap in spring 2025, we have begun the process of building our next strategic plan for 2025 and beyond. Grounded in our mission and Catholic, Jesuit identity, the new plan will outline strategies and goals to address external challenges and opportunities and address internal assessment and other growth & improvement targets. Steered by the University Planning Committee (UPC), members of the faculty, staff and student body have already begun to contribute to this work through participation in discussions and surveys. Members of the Board of Trustees will also be asked to contribute to the process via a strategic planning survey this summer. A draft plan will be prepared and shared with members of the University community in early fall 2024.

FULBRIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS

I am pleased to report that our two Fulbright finalists have been notified that they were awarded a Fulbright Scholarship.

- Shelby Traver, a Political Science and International Business double major has been awarded a Fulbright to study in Rwanda. Her project is entitled "The Secondary Effects of the Rwanda Gender Quota on the Bureaucracy and Legislative Staff."
- Adrian Laudani, a member of the class of 2018 has been awarded an English Language
 Teaching Assistantship in Spain. She received a bachelor's degree in Counseling and
 Human Services in 2018 and served in the Jesuit Volunteer Corps after graduation and
 received a master's degree in International Studies from the University of San Francisco
 in 2023. Adrian will be teaching English at the secondary level in either Madrid or
 Malaga.
