Donna M. Carroll, Ed.D.

Throughout her life's journey, Donna Carroll has answered the call to a vocation steeped in Catholic, Jesuit higher education.

Growing up in a New York Jesuit family and shaped by Catholic education in her formative years, the values she learned inspired a deeply student-focused leadership style that has been both formative and transformative. For almost 30 years, she served with distinction as President of Dominican University, where she was known for her mission-centered, student-centric approach, shepherding the institution through dramatic change.

Leading with gratitude and compassion, Donna embodied an unwavering commitment to help students from all backgrounds succeed. Her legacy at Dominican University is marked by dedication to educating students of color, a pledge to close the equity gap, support of faith-based organizations and trailblazing action on behalf of students on the margins. By the conclusion of her tenure at Dominican, the university had risen significantly in national rankings, becoming one of the top 20 master's-level universities in the Midwest according to *U.S. News & World Report*.

Her many contributions to Catholic higher education were recognized by the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities (ACCU), which celebrated her enviable accomplishments with the prestigious Rev. Theodore Hesburgh, CSC Award, its highest honor. She has served on national, corporate and statewide boards, including the Board of Trustees at The University of Scranton. Sought after for her vast expertise, in 2024 she was named President of ACCU, which serves as the collective voice of Catholic higher education in the United States.

An outspoken advocate for immigration reform and the rights of undocumented students, Donna, on behalf of Dominican University, was honored with the 2012 Community Change Maker Award from P.A.S.O., a community-based social justice organization dedicated to serving Latino youth and their parents in Chicago's western suburbs. She is the recipient of the "Strangers No Longer" Award from the Archdiocese of Chicago and the "Moral Courage" Award from Faith in Public Life. She has been named one of the "100 Women of Influence" by *Today's Chicago Woman*, a *Chicago Tribune* "Remarkable Woman," and was listed among the top ten women in education by the *Chicago Sun-Times*.

For Donna Carroll, however, the greatest reward comes from the opportunity to be a servant leader — a person for and with others in the true Ignatian spirit. Jack Raslowsky

A highly accomplished and respected leader in Jesuit secondary education, Jack Raslowsky has embodied a lived faith that does justice for more than 35 years as an educator and administrator.

From his early days as a teacher at St. Anthony High School and St. Peter's Prep, Jack wove the cherished Catholic tradition of social justice into the fabric of lessons in science and health. His innovative and Jesuit-aligned approach to education did not go unnoticed. He excelled through roles as principal, superintendent and provincial assistant before being named the first lay president of Xavier High School in New York City. The provincial superior of the USA East Province of the Society of Jesus tapped into his talent as well as he served for several years as Provincial Assistant for Secondary Education.

Deeply dedicated to honoring the dignity of every human being, Jack has been a champion for the marginalized, leading Xavier High School to be recognized as a safe space for a diverse community of students and their families. Under Jack's leadership, Xavier High School has become known for its commitment to excellence, human dignity, inclusion and spiritual formation.

Active in faith-based educational and community organizations, Jack has been a valued member of the boards of the Ignatian Solidarity Network, Nativity Mission Center, St. Ignatius School, Cristo Rey School New York and Brooklyn Jesuit Preparatory.

His exemplary commitment to social justice has been recognized through the Robert M. Holstein Faith Doing Justice Award, given by the Ignatian Solidarity Network to individuals who have demonstrated a significant commitment to leadership for social justice grounded in the spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Yet, in accepting the award, he reflected not on his own accomplishments, but on those of others who work to make the world that God dreams of a reality. For Jack Raslowsky, the greatest lessons come from a generous heart in service to others.

While Jack will retire from Xavier High School in 2027, he leaves behind a legacy of selfless service rooted in Ignatian spirituality to uphold the common good. Vincent F. Reilly, Esq. '80

As an attorney, husband, father and philanthropist, Vincent Reilly passionately lives the mission of Jesuit education in countless ways.

With not just four but eight years of Jesuit education at Saint Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia and The University of Scranton, Vince entered Villanova University's Law School before launching a highly successful career in personal injury defense practice in the state and federal courts of Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Known as an exceptional businessman dedicated to his practice, clients and employees, Vince was the law partner of fellow Royal Kevin O'Brien, Esq. '80, for 17 years before founding Reilly, McDevitt and Henrich, where he is the firm's co-managing partner. In true Ignatian spirit, he finds the most rewarding part of his work in the cura personalis moments of providing legal services for someone who cannot afford an attorney.

Purple runs proudly through the Reilly family. Vince's wife, Eileen, is a 1982 graduate of Scranton, and John Fitzpatrick, S.J., an influential figure in the Reillys' Scranton days, married the couple. Four of Vince and Eileen's five children are loyal Royals, and three were baptized by Fr. Fitzpatrick.

Authentically devoted to helping those of modest means, Vince and Kevin O'Brien founded the Friends of St. Malachy to benefit and support the parish and school of that same name in North Philadelphia. The Friends remains active today, continuing in its mission to assist this crucial church, school and community center. Within the St. Malachy community, he is known for being exceptionally generous with his time; there is no request too small or too large.

Vince served with distinction on our University's Board of Trustees from 2011-2017 and again from 2018-2025. He was Board Chair from 2022-2025. He was also a member of the Executive Committee of the University's capital campaign, "A Fire that Kindles Other Fires," and is a recipient of the distinguished Frank O'Hara Alumni Award, the highest award bestowed jointly by the University and its Alumni Society.

In all that he does, Vince is an agent for justice and peace, ignited by the spirit of St. Ignatius and with a genuine love for those on the margins. Peter John "P.J." Carlesimo

To most people, basketball is a sport to be watched, played or enjoyed. For a select few, however, it is a calling — a vocation that is an integral part of the human experience. Peter John "P.J." Carlesimo is one of these few — a legendary basketball coach who has led college, NBA and Olympic teams to major wins while remaining grounded in the Jesuit values he learned while shadowing his father, a major figure in The University of Scranton's athletic programs.

In nearly 40 years as a basketball coach, P.J. enjoyed immense success at both the collegiate and professional levels, becoming a household name in the sport. Beginning at his alma mater of Fordham University, he moved on to coach at New Hampshire College and then Wagner College before being named head coach at Seton Hall, where he oversaw the rebuilding of the Pirates' program to national prominence.

Named Seton Hall's "Coach of the Century," P.J.'s 12-season career with the university resulted in 212 winning games, including five seasons of 20-plus victories, and six NCAA Tournament appearances. During that time, P.J.'s career took the Olympic stage as assistant coach of the 1992 U.S. men's Olympic basketball team, the gold medal-winning "Dream Team."

During a 17-year career on the NBA sidelines, P.J. went on to win 239 games as a head coach over parts of nine seasons with five organizations: Portland, Golden State, Seattle/Oklahoma City and Brooklyn. As an assistant coach, he won three titles with the San Antonio Spurs.

After finishing his coaching career, he moved into the broadcast booth, working for ESPN, TNT, Westwood One, Fox Sports, the Pac-12 Network, NBC and Comcast Sportsnet. He remains a regular contributor to SportsCenter and calls select NBA games, including the Finals, for ESPN Radio, as well as working NCAA basketball for Westwood One.

A member of the Hall of Fame at both Wagner College and Seton Hall University, P.J. was also inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the 1992 Olympic team. At The University of Scranton, P.J. is a strong supporter of the Carlesimo Golf Tournament and Award Dinner held in memory of his late father, Peter A. Carlesimo, as a major fundraising event for Scranton athletics.

History of the University

The University of Scranton was founded as Saint Thomas College by Most Reverend William G. O’Hara, the first Bishop of Scranton, who had always hoped to provide an opportunity for higher education in the Lackawanna Valley. In August of 1888, with few resources at hand, he blessed a single block of granite as a cornerstone for his new college, which would admit its first students four years later. (The cornerstone of Old Main is preserved in the wall of St. Thomas Hall located at the corner of Linden Street and Monroe Avenue.)

The college was staffed by diocesan priests and seminarians until 1896 and then, for one year, by the Xaverian Brothers. From 1897 until 1942 the school, which was renamed The University of Scranton in 1938, was administered for the Diocese by the Christian Brothers. In the late summer of 1942, at the invitation of Bishop William Hafey, 19 Jesuits, including the University’s first Jesuit President, Rev. Coleman Nevils, S.J., arrived on campus to administer the University.

The Jesuits restructured and strengthened Scranton’s traditional and pre-professional programs with an emphasis on the liberal arts, which are the foundation for every program at a Jesuit university. This emphasis is intended to give students an appreciation for all disciplines as they develop specific subject knowledge. The University has flourished as a Catholic and Jesuit institution, growing from what was primarily a commuter college with fewer than 1,000 students to a broadly regional, comprehensive university with a total enrollment of approximately 4,600 students in undergraduate, graduate and non-traditional programs.

In September 2021, Rev. Joseph G. Marina, S.J., was inaugurated as the University’s 29th president. During his tenure, the University has continued its commitment to enriching the quality and variety of its academic offerings for the success of its students.

The University of Scranton leads confidently into the future, embracing a suite of four goals designed to guide our priorities through 2026-2030. Rooted in Jesuit values and a renewed vision, the new strategic plan, “Forging Our Future,” reflects adaptability, responding to emerging trends and challenges in higher education.

All three of the University’s colleges have added academic programs in recent years in wide-ranging areas,

from STEM and the humanities to health sciences and business. New program areas include cybercrime investigation and cybersecurity, mechanical engineering, business analytics, psychiatric mental health nursing and speech-language pathology.

In addition, the University continues to invest in campus enhancements to provide students with the best living, extracurricular and learning spaces. More than \$400 million in facilities improvements made in recent years include the most substantial capital projects in University history: The Patrick and Margaret DeNaples Center, Loyola Science Center and Edward R. Leahy Jr. Hall, which houses the departments of Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Health and Human Performance. In 2021, 5,000 square feet of new mechanical engineering labs and shop area were added in Hyland Hall.

The University built the 11-acre Rev. Kevin P. Quinn, S.J., Athletics Campus along Broadway Street in Scranton as home to the University’s soccer, lacrosse, field hockey, baseball and softball Division III NCAA teams.

Most recently, in September 2025, the University dedicated and blessed Robert S. ’68 and Marilyn A. Weiss Hall, a nearly 90,000-square-foot center for workforce development, applied research and outreach. Located on the 300 block of Madison Avenue, the building includes academic departments, student health and wellness space and a 10,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art IDEA Center.

Scranton is counted among America’s finest universities, according to a range of national publications. For 32 years, U.S. News & World Report has ranked Scranton among the “top 10 master’s universities in the North.” Year after year, the University is listed among the “best colleges” by Forbes and The Princeton Review. The University is also consistently ranked among the “best values” in college education by U.S. News & World Report. PayScale’s most recent Salary Report in 2024 ranks Scranton in the top 16 percent of universities listed by the median salaries of their alumni. The University’s efforts in community engagement were recognized with distinction in the 2026 Carnegie Community Engagement Classification, a designation awarded to just 237 institutions of higher learning nationwide.

Academic Regalia

The colorful attire worn by the graduates, faculty and officers of the University and by the academic delegates has its roots in medieval traditions that reach back to the earliest universities – to Paris, Bologna, Oxford and Cambridge. The precise origins of the several parts of the academic garb are unknown, but since medieval students enjoyed the status of clerics during their university years, we assume that their attire was inspired by the clerical dress of the time. Early European universities required students and teachers to wear distinctive gowns at all times. The tradition was brought to this country in colonial times, but the requirement for students soon disappeared and professors limited the custom to special occasions.

The Gown. Gowns are generally black, and there are three basic types. The bachelor’s gown is plain with a fairly elaborate yoke and long, pointed sleeves. It is worn closed. The master’s gown is similar to the bachelor’s except that the sleeves are open at the forearms and end with an extra, square-shaped swatch of cloth that originally formed a pocket for reading and writing materials. Master’s gowns are worn either open or closed. The doctoral gown, the most elaborate of the three, is adorned with velvet panels on the closed front and around the neck and three velvet

bars on each full, bell-shaped sleeve. Although black is the most common color, the velvet panels and sleeve bars may vary according to the faculty that granted the wearer’s degree.

The Hood. The colors of the hood reveal the level of a degree, the major field of learning in which the degree was awarded, and the institution by which the degree was conferred. The bachelor’s, master’s and doctoral hoods are three, three and one-half, and four feet long, respectively. The all-encompassing velvet trim that denotes the field of learning is likewise, two, three, or five inches, respectively. The lining of the hood is worn exposed to show the colors of the school awarding the degree. Most schools have a two-color pattern using chevrons or bars to differentiate schools whose colors may be alike or very similar. The University of Scranton hood, for example, is lined in royal purple with a white chevron.

The Cap. Generally, the mortarboard or Oxford cap is worn with all degrees, although an Elizabethan-style soft cap is used with some doctoral attire. Black tassels are most often used, but many schools have adopted the practice of using tassels matching the hood color. Doctors and presidents of institutions frequently wear a gold tassel.

The University Mace

The University Mace is traditionally carried at the head of academic processions as a symbol of educational authority and institutional identity. The mace consists of a 56-inch polished aluminum staff topped with an engraving of the great seal of the University with sunburst

accents formed by cut-metal rays. The symbol of the Society of Jesus appears on the rear of the mace. The seal is echoed on the verges, which consist of shorter hardwood rods topped with an engraving of the great seal of the University in brass.

The Presidential Medallion

In ancient and medieval Europe medallions of office were worn as breastplates by figures of authority or distinction. The University of Scranton Presidential Medallion is such a symbol, and it continues the tradition of incorporating educational, religious and historic icons that describe the institution's distinctive character.

The center of the medallion is an enameled rendering of the great seal of the University surrounded by rays. The principal colors of the seal are the traditional colors of the University, white and royal purple. On the purple field is a horizontal silver bar containing, in purple, a star derived from the Seal of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, a symbol taken from the seal of Saint Thomas College, the predecessor of the University, and two stacks of wheat from the obverse of the coat of arms of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The upper half of the seal contains, in gold, two wolves grasping a cauldron suspended from a chain. They are taken from the coat of arms of the family of Saint Ignatius Loyola, and they identify the University as a Jesuit institution. Below the silver bar is a golden rising sun, symbolic of Saint Thomas Aquinas, the shining light of the Church and the patron of the University.

The border of the seal reproduces the border of the shield of the Diocese of Scranton and the silver hemispheres are taken from William Penn's coat of arms. The crest is a golden cross of the style known as Patonce. It symbolizes Christ, the goal and the norm of the University's educational efforts, and it complements the motto the University has had since it was entrusted to the care of the Christian Brothers in 1899: *Religio, Mores, Cultura*.

The great seal is surrounded by the name of the institution and its founding date, 1888, and is further embellished by a sunburst of rays also derived from the iconic symbol of Saint Thomas Aquinas.

The Presidential Medallion is worn on a silver chain with links inspired by carved wooden moldings in The Estate, the ancestral home of the Scranton family. It is engraved with the names of the previous presidents and the founder of the University. The chain is connected by a link adorned with the symbol of the Society of Jesus.

The medallion was designed and crafted for the University by Mr. William Reidsema of Clarks Summit, Pennsylvania.

The Heraldic Banners

The University commissioned the ten heraldic banners carried in the academic procession to celebrate the 450th anniversary of the founding of the first Jesuit college in Messina, Sicily (1548), and the 110th anniversary of the founding of Saint Thomas College (1888), the precursor of The University of Scranton. The heraldic devices on the banners bear witness to the influences that have endowed the University with its distinctive identity.

- ❖ The banner adorned with the seal of the Society of Jesus (IHS, surmounted with a cross above three nails and surrounded with a halo of rays) announces that The University of Scranton is a Jesuit university.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the seal of the family of Saint Ignatius Loyola (a golden pot suspended between two wolves) bears witness to the fact that the University's educational philosophy is derived from the thought of Saint Ignatius (1491–1556), the founder of the Society of Jesus.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the seal of the Diocese of Scranton (a star rising between two crossed keys) recalls and celebrates the fact that the University was founded by the Most Reverend William O'Hara, D.D., the first Bishop of Scranton.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the seal of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (the five-pointed star) honors the Christian Brothers' half century of devoted service to the students of Saint Thomas College and The University of Scranton.
- ❖ The banner adorned with a device drawn from the seal of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the stack of wheat) both identifies the University's location and proclaims its special mission to the citizens of Pennsylvania.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the iconic symbol of Saint Thomas Aquinas (the radiant sunburst) recalls both the name of the University's precursor college (Saint Thomas College) and announces that Saint Thomas remains the heavenly patron of the University.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the crown refers to the nickname of the University's athletic

teams (The Royals) and announces that, in the tradition of the *Spiritual Exercises* of Saint Ignatius Loyola, all of the sons and daughters of the University are called to follow Christ the King.

- ❖ The banner adorned with the picture of the sailing ship celebrates the devoted service that the members of the Maryland Province of the Society of Jesus (whose ancestors in the faith arrived in America in 1634 aboard the *Ark* and the *Dove*) have rendered to the University and its students since 1942.
- ❖ The banner adorned with the Cross of Patonce suspended above an unfurled banner bears witness to the fact that the University is a Christian institution of higher learning. The legend on the banner bears the motto of the University: "Religio, Mores, Cultura."
- ❖ The banner adorned with the Chi Rho superimposed upon an open book testifies to the University's belief that, as its Mission Statement says, "Jesus Christ is the primary source for the values and attitudes that imbue the culture of its campus."

The Class Banner

- ❖ The banner indicating the graduating class's year, first presented when the class arrives on campus for Fall Welcome, is a mainstay at special functions. It signifies unity, identity and spirit of the class as a whole. The banner welcomes students back as alumni, particularly during milestone reunions.
