In order to assess their ability to find the article in the Library’s holdings or to request the article via Inter-library Loan. 47% of the students were able to do this correctly.	During Spring 2017 (the next time this class is offered), I intend to create a PPT (similar to the one I created for EXSC 435) to document the step-by-step process that students need to follow in order to find out if the full-text of an article is available in the Library’s holdings or if an Interlibrary Loan request needs to be placed.

The fact that a paraphrase must be cited will be emphasized.
