Summary of research assignment or task

Students will be co-developing a wiki-based encyclopedia on the History of Science. Students will need to identify appropriate sources, including where to look and how to evaluate the authority of the resource.

Classroom Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) – at least one, no more than three

SLO 1: Students will learn to develop a research plan.

SLO 2: Students will be introduced to four resources suitable for their research.

SLO 3: Students will understand the basics of source evaluation.

How will you know how students are doing as they work toward meeting these outcomes?

Dr. Sampson and I plan to continue to collaborate on this project. He hopes to build the wiki-based encyclopedia over time. So, in addition to discussing the students' performance with Dr. Sampson, I'll also be able to review the work.
