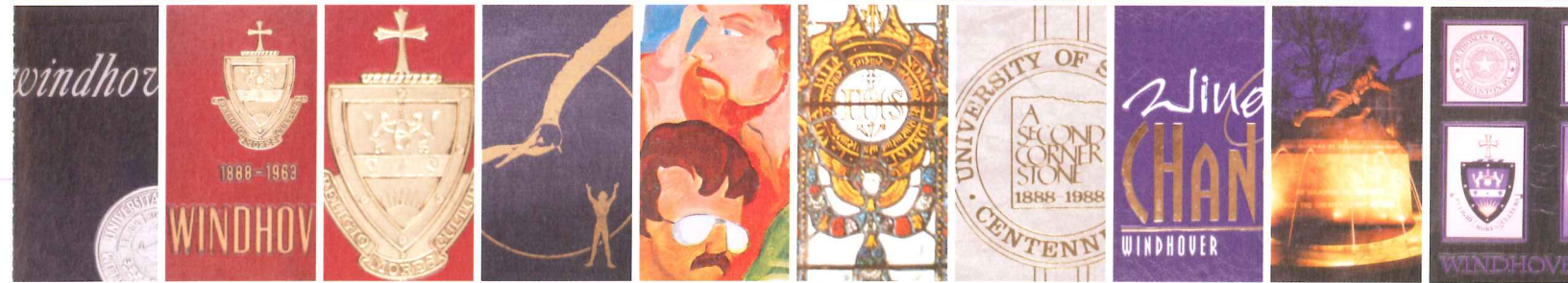

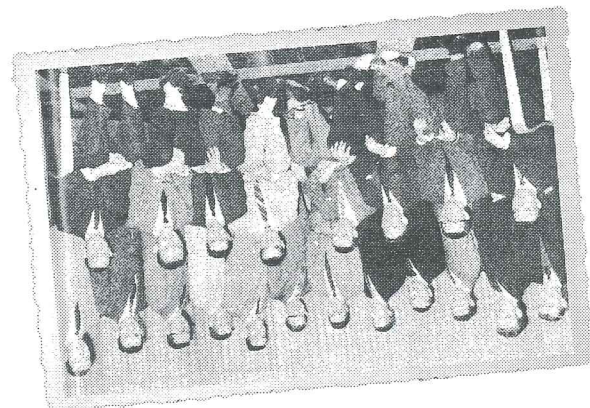
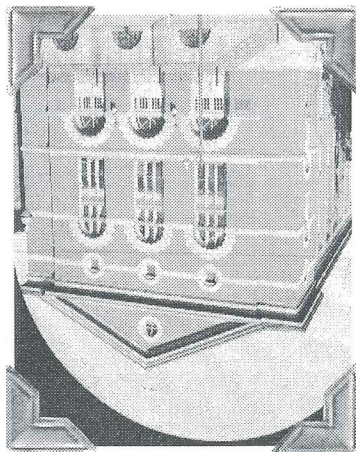
Whether or not you have attended past reunions, please join us for this once-in-a-lifetime event.
