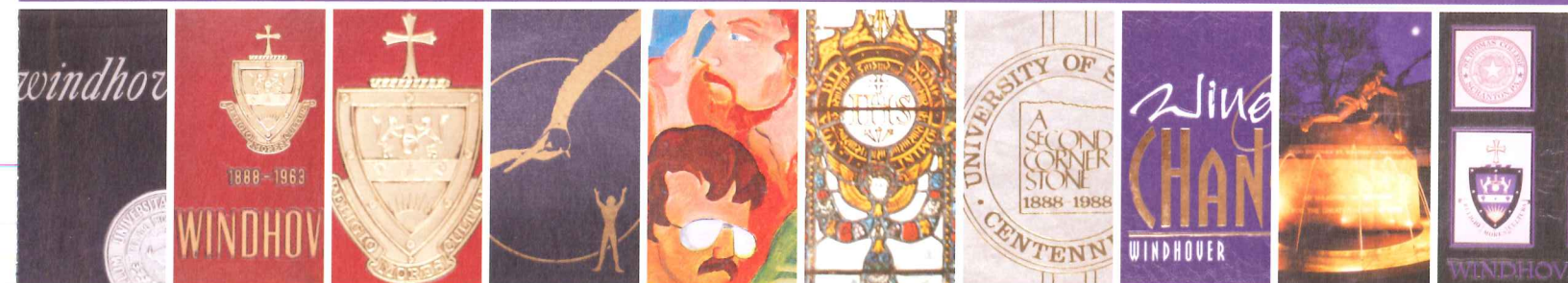

Absolutely everything you need to know is in this letter. However, if you still have questions, please feel free to call 1-800-SCRANTON any time.

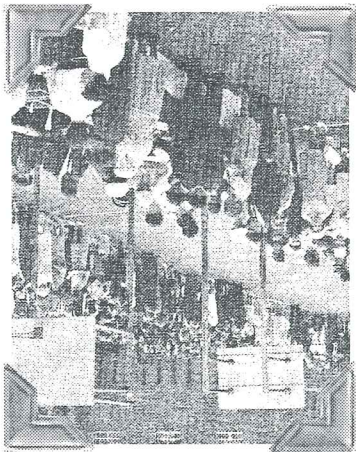
