What is a Protected Characteristic, Category or Class?

What is Discrimination?

The **denial of rights** to participate in University programs and activities generally provided or made available that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it **unreasonably interferes** with or **limits a student's ability** to participate in or benefit from the programs based on a protected status.

What is Harrassment?

The creation of a **hostile** or **intimidating environment** that is severe or pervasive that interferes with a student's education, and the hostile or intimidating environment is based on a protected class.

Non-Discrimination Statement

The University is committed to providing an educational, residential, and working environment that is free from harassment and discrimination. Members of the University community, applicants for employment or admissions, guests and visitors have the right to be free from harassment or discrimination based on race, color, religion, ancestry, gender, sex, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, age, disability, genetic information, national origin, veteran status, or any other status protected by applicable law.
