

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF SCRANTON  
and  
LACKAWANNA COLLEGE**

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**I. PURPOSE**

This agreement between The University of Scranton and Lackawanna College establishes a mechanism for graduates of Lackawanna College to complete the requirements for baccalaureate degrees at The University of Scranton.

This articulation agreement does not allow direct transfer of associate degrees in business. Business courses are listed in an addendum, indicating their transferability.

Normally Lackawanna College graduates will transfer in 60 credits and will gain junior standing.

**II. GOALS**

1. To provide a well defined transfer agreement that will enable Lackawanna College students to plan their academic career so to minimize credit loss when they transfer to The University of Scranton to earn their baccalaureate degree.
2. To recruit students with associate degrees whose academic goals include acquisition of a baccalaureate degree.

**III. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT REVIEW**

The articulation agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis beginning one year after approval.

**IV. APPLICATION PROCESS**

Traditional age students who seek to attend The University of Scranton should apply through the Director of Admissions. Adults students age 24 and older should apply through Dexter Hanley College.

## **V. TRANSFER CONDITIONS**

1. Lackawanna College students who wish to transfer to The University of Scranton must submit an application and the following credentials:

- Official transcript(s) from the college(s) attended
- Personal statement of goals
- Official high school record or official GED score report (if associate degree has not been attained)\*
- SAT scores (if associate degree has not been attained)\*

\* At the discretion of The University Admissions Committee, the high school transcript and/or SAT requirement may be waived.

2. Students will normally be admitted provided (1) the academic average of the candidate is (3.0) "B," and (2) the student left/graduated in good standing. Applicants with a GPA of less than 3.0 are encouraged to supply the admissions committee with additional documentation/credentials to further support their application.
3. Transfer credit will be awarded if the courses to be transferred are equivalent to courses offered at The University of Scranton. No credit will be given for courses with grades less than "C". Students transferring from Lackawanna College shall be required to complete curricular subjects prescribed in the degree program as outlined by the catalog which they are to follow at The University of Scranton.
4. A minimum of 63 credits earned at The University of Scranton is required of transfer students for degree eligibility. It should be noted that some departments require that at least half of the credits in the student's major be taken at The University of Scranton.
5. Associate degrees in Business do not transfer directly.
6. Cooperative education courses and internships will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.
7. Experiential learning credits are not transferable.
8. Transfer students are admitted into the nursing program on a space available basis.

## **VI. LIBERAL STUDIES**

Many adult students opt to earn a degree in Liberal Studies because it allows for greater transferability of credits.

The Liberal Studies major is a highly individualized program offered exclusively through Dexter Hanley College. Applicants who have attended other accredited colleges may transfer up to 60 credits for applicable courses in which a grade of "C" or better was earned. Students who qualify for this interdisciplinary degree

program are permitted to earn as many as 30 semester hours for academically relevant experience as outlined by the catalog.

In developing the areas of concentration, the student will select 3 or 4 fields of study, with at least 15 credits but not more than 24 credits in any single field. Careful attention must be given to selecting the areas of study as well as to determining the number of credits to be taken in each area selected. Thus, the student may be asked to seek advice from faculty members in several departments before drawing up a final degree plan.

Up to 30 credits of business courses are allowed in the concentration areas, in keeping with AACSB accreditation guidelines.

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**ADDENDUM  
TRANSFERABILITY OF BUSINESS COURSES**

The University of Scranton is seeking AACSB accreditation, and therefore must comply with their restrictions on transferability of business courses. Because some Lackawanna College students may want to earn a degree in business from The University of Scranton, earn a minor in business, or use their business courses in the Liberal Studies degree, the rules governing transferability of business courses are listed below.

**MAJOR**

The courses that will transfer directly into the business major are outlined on the following pages.

Business majors who seek to transfer upper level courses from Lackawanna College may, with permission of the dean of the School of Management, validate some Lackawanna College courses. MG 111, MK 101 and MG 215 can be validated by successfully completing specified advanced courses for which the course in transfer is a foundation; AC 211, AC 212, AC 215, and AC 219 can be validated by successfully completing a challenge exam. At least 50% of all business credits must be taken at The University of Scranton to receive a baccalaureate degree in any area of business.

**MINORS**

Students can transfer in all of their business courses. However, upper level business courses can not be used toward a business major. (See major above.)

**LIBERAL STUDIES**

Up to 30 credits of business courses taken at Lackawanna College can be used in the Liberal Studies degree, in keeping with AACSB guidelines.

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
