Scranton Fulbright Fellows Break 100 Mark

The number of Fulbright Fellows from the University – poised at 99 for the past year – broke the 100 mark this month with the announcement that six University students have received fellowships to pursue graduate study and research abroad beginning in the 2001-2002 academic year.

The selection of these students to America's premier international scholarship program brings to 105 the total number of University of Scranton students to receive Fulbright or other prestigious international fellowships since 1972.

"This year, as the number of Fulbright recipients at the University breaks the 100 mark, we begin a new chapter of the Fulbright story at Scranton," said University President Joseph M. McShane, S.J. "The University is also justifiably proud of its record of Fulbright finalists – 140 since 1972 – including all seven of our applicants in 2001."

The 2001 graduates from the University accepted to the Fulbright program are

Nicole Heron, Franklin Square, N.Y.; Carol Gleeson, Bronx, N.Y.; Erin Friel, Cedarville, N.J.; Lisa Biagiotti, Cliffside Park, N.J.; Maria Atzert, Cape May Court House, N.J.; and Clifford McMurray, Clarks Summit.

"Because these grants are so competitive, it is truly remarkable for an institution of our size to win six Fulbrights in one year," said Susan Trussler, Ph.D., Fulbright Advisor and Associate Professor of Economics/Finance.

Approximately 500 colleges and universities nationwide submit applications each year. In 1999-2000, for example, only seven percent of the institutions vying for Fulbright fellowships had six or more winners. These institutions were predominantly ivy-league schools and large public and private research institutions.

Ms. Heron will spend the 2001-2002 academic year in Finland, where she will examine the way in which Marx's theory of dialectical materialism has affected managerial accounting in Finland. In May, Ms. Heron earned her MBA and received the Outstanding Graduate Award in Business Administration. She earned her bachelor's degree in accounting, magna cum laude, from The University of Scranton in 2000.

Ms. Gleeson will be studying in the biology department at the Universidad Nacional de Asunción (UNA) in Paraguay. As part of her master's studies at UNA, she will undertake a research project examining the competitive interactions between three closely related and similar species of bats. Ms. Gleeson earned her Bachelor of Science degree, magna cum laude, with a triple major in Biology, Modern Language/Spanish and Philosophy.

Ms. Friel will be traveling to Germany, where she will teach English and American studies in a secondary school. She will also continue research started at Scranton on the works of female German writers of World War I. Ms. Friel earned her Bachelor of Arts degree, summa cum laude, in English and Modern Language/German and received the Professor Joseph B. Cullather Award for Excellence in English.

Ms. Biagiotti has received a Fulbright fellowship for study in Italy, where she will explore the Italian government's colonial policy toward the Muslim elements of the empire. Ms. Biagiotti earned her Bachelor

of Arts degree, magna cum laude, with a triple major in History, Philosophy and Modern Language/Italian.

Ms. Atzert will be teaching English as a second language in a Korean middle school. She will also use her Fulbright experience to learn the Korean language and to continue a comparative study of Eastern and Western philosophy. Ms. Atzert earned a Bachelor of Science degree, cum laude, in International Studies and

Philosophy and received the Excellence in International Studies Award.

Mr. McMurray has earned a Fulbright fellowship to study financial and management practices of the German space industry. Mr. McMurray earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from Wichita State University and his MBA from The University of Scranton in May, when he received the Outstanding Graduate Award in Business Administration.

A Commencement of "Firsts"

Commencement Held at First Union Arena – for the First Time



The First Union Arena was at near-capacity seating for the University's undergraduate commencement ceremony on 27 May.

More than 8,000 people filled the First Union Arena at Casey Plaza, Wilkes-Barre, on 27 May to witness the conferring of 879 bachelor's and associate's degrees.

It was the 101st undergraduate commencement ceremony of the University – and the first to be held at the First Union Arena.

The commencement procession entered the arena to the strains of "The Joy," performed by the University Bands and Choirs under the direction of Cheryl Boga.

Sister Helen Prejean, C.S.J., the international best-selling author of *Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the U.S.*, gave the principal address.

In her remarks, Sister Prejean encouraged members of the graduating class to bring passion to their chosen careers. She reflected on her own calling to help the poor of New Orleans and to work as a spiritual advisor to a death-row inmate, as she encouraged the class of 2001 to practice love and compassion.

Sister Prejean received an honorary degree from the University, as did U.S. Ambassador to Argentina James D. Walsh '69 and JoAnne M. Kuehner, founder of

Hope for Haiti. Also receiving honorary degrees were Edward R. Leahy, Esq. '68, immediate past chairman of the Board of Trustees of the University; Mary Eagen McDonald, also a past trustee of the University and a dedicated community leader; and, posthumously, Herbert M. McDonald, M.D. '35, a distinguished surgeon.

On 26 May, the Byron Center on campus was the setting of the Graduate School Commencement, at which 249 master's degrees were conferred.

Martin Marty, Ph.D., one of America's foremost theologians and religious historians, was the principal speaker. Both he and Frank Cimini '39, professor emeritus of modern Foreign Languages, received honorary degrees during the ceremony.

Dr. Marty told the audience that "The University of Scranton experience has been about the intention to fulfill, nourish, enhance and bring to completion all life. It has taught you what Pascal knew: 'It is not certain that everything is uncertain.' It is certain that, insofar as college can do so, it has helped you be prepared for contingencies."

Sophomore Selected for Statistical System Junior Fellow

Scranton Sophomore Leslie J. (Les) Carter is one of just 50 students nationwide to be selected for a Federal Statistical System Junior Fellow for the Joint Program in Survey Methodology (JPSM). Mr. Carter is completing his summer internship at the Bureau of Labor Statistics in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Carter was chosen as a JPSM Fellow by a national selection board of faculty from universities across the country. He joins a group of talented students who have a strong interest in the quantitative study of social and economic phenomena and who are assembling strong undergraduate academic records.

During his internship, the mathematics major and computer sciences minor from the University will work with staff members at the Bureau of Labor Statistics, which collects information about a variety of labor issues, including consumer prices, inflation, unemployment statistics, salaries and worker safety.

After compiling statistical data, the Bureau assembles the information into a format that is easily understood and readily available to the public, explained Mr. Carter. For his own part in this process, Mr. Carter's internship is likely to involve the review of surveys, the analysis of results and the development of Web-related resources.

A resident of Moscow, Mr. Carter is a member of the Special Jesuit Liberal Arts (SJLA) Program and Honors Program, a work-study student in the College of Arts and Sciences Advising Center, a peer tutor for the Learning Resource Center, a member of the University's baseball team and a participant in the University Bands and Singers. He is also one of only 38 students in Pennsylvania to become a member of the Brain Gain team recently appointed by Governor Tom Ridge to coordinate efforts from Pennsylvania schools seeking to keep college graduates in the state.

DEP Grant Supports Collaborative Initiative

Students at Scranton Preparatory School will soon have access to the latest technologies and techniques in molecular research through a collaborative program with the University that was outlined on 1 June at Prep.

U.S. Rep. Don Sherwood announced a \$500,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to support the creation of the Initiative of Excellence in Science and Technology at Scranton Preparatory School and The University of Scranton. Initial plans for the program were developed under the auspices of U.S. Rep. Joseph M. McDade, who also attended the announcement of the program.

The initiative will seek to advance the development of science and technology curriculum in high schools, to foster collaboration in molecular research between faculty at Scranton Preparatory School and researchers in the University's Institute for Molecular Biology and Medicine (IMBM), and to prepare students at Scranton Prep for careers in science and technology.

"I am grateful for the support that we were able to secure from the Department of Energy for an initiative that will prepare our region's young people to pursue careers in the sciences," said Congressman Sherwood. "In addition, the relationship that the grant will foster between Scranton Prep and The University of Scranton will serve as a model for collaboration between high schools and higher education."

"We are deeply grateful to Congressman Sherwood and his predecessor Congressman Joseph McDade for their help in securing a grant that will benefit both our students and faculty," said Herbert Keller, S.J., President of Scranton Preparatory School.

"In addition, we look forward to the opportunity to broaden our already strong ties to our sister Jesuit institution, The University of Scranton."

The grant will support the following:

- the creation of two technology-rich laboratories at Scranton Prep equipped with 64 computer workstations;
- the establishment of an annual one-week summer internship at the IMBM through which six students and two faculty members from Prep will be able to study theories and laboratory techniques associated with molecular sciences;
- a review of the science curriculum at Prep to identify ways to incorporate teaching techniques related to molecular science; and
- the purchase of state-of-the-art equipment to support molecular experiments in Prep's science labs.

Scottoline to Receive Distinguished Author Award

Best-selling author Lisa Scottoline will receive the 2001 Distinguished Author Award from the Friends of the Weinberg Memorial Library at The University of Scranton. The award will be given at a "Meet the Author" reception on 15 September. A book-signing is also planned.

The author of eight critically acclaimed thrillers, Ms. Scottoline's books include *The New York Times* best sellers *Moment of Truth* and *Mistaken Identity*. With a writing style described by USA Today as "sharp, intelligent, funny, and hip," Ms. Scottoline's novels draw on her experience as a trial lawyer in one of Philadelphia's largest corporate firms as well as her judicial clerkships in the state and federal justice systems.

A magna cum laude graduate of the University of Pennsylvania with a bachelor's degree in English, Ms. Scottoline also graduated cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania's law school in 1981. She worked as a litigator at the prestigious law firm of Dechert, Price and Rhoads in Philadelphia and for a federal appellate judge.

With the birth of her baby, she retired from law to raise her daughter. She began writing while her infant slept, basing her first novel on her experiences as a lawyer. After three years, she completed her first novel *Everywhere That Mary Went*.

In 1994, the Mystery Writers of America nominated *Everywhere That Mary Went* for the Edgar Award, the premiere award in suspense fiction. Her second novel, *Final Appeal*, won the Edgar Award the following year.

O'Hara Awards Presented at Alumni Reunion Weekend

About 500 alumni returned to campus for Alumni Reunion Weekend, 8 -10 June. The event included a variety of activities across campus, including the presentation of eight Frank J. O'Hara Awards.

The O'Hara Awards, named for the late administrator who served The University of Scranton for 53 years, recognize alumni and others who have achieved distinction in their professions or personal endeavors. The O'Hara Award is the highest honor bestowed jointly by the University and its Alumni Society.

This year's award recipients are Jean-Paul Bonnet, D.O., Sparta, N.J.; Melissa Conway, Ph.D., Moreno Valley, Ca.; James C. Doyle, Alexandria, Va.; Edward J. Hayes, Los Altos Hills, Ca.; Edward G. Lakatta, M.D., Bel Air, Md.; Karen L. Pennington, Ph.D., Upper Montclair, N.J.; Frank C. Sabatino, Esq., Voorhees, N.J.; and Joseph Mesko, Dunmore.

Dr. Bonnet '76 received the award for community service. He is a physician of osteopathic medicine with a practice based in northern New Jersey. He founded the International Modular Medical Educational Delivery Systems, a non-profit organization that develops modular medical clinics that provide direct medical services to the disadvantaged of Haiti and sub-Saharan Africa.

Dr. Conway '76 received the award for arts and letters. She is head of Special Collections at the University of California, Riverside, and professor of Historical Bibliography at the University of California, Los Angeles. She previously held posts at the National Gallery of Art, the Library of Congress and other nationally recognized arts organizations.

Mr. Doyle '66 received the award for university service. He was named to the University's Board of Trustees in 1985. He has served as a volunteer leader for two

capital campaigns, is past President and Secretary of the University's Alumni Society and a current member of the Board of Regents. Mr. Doyle is Vice President, Investments, with the Washington, D.C., office of Advest, a regional financial services firm.

Mr. Hayes '61 received the award for science and technology. He is Chief Executive Officer and President of RivalWatch, Inc., a software application start-up in the Silicon Valley. For the past 35 years, Mr. Hayes has held senior executive positions with technology-based companies, including Hewlett Packard and Solectron Corporation. In the early years of his career, he worked for NASA Goddard Space Flight Center.

Dr. Lakatta '66 received the award for medicine. He is director of the Laboratory of Cardiovascular Science, the National Institute on Aging, at the National Institutes of Health. He also holds adjunct appointments as professor in the Department of Physiology at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, and professor in the Cardiology Division at John Hopkins School of Medicine.

Dr. Pennington '76 received the award for education. Her career in higher education spans six institutions in four states. She is currently Vice President for Student Development at Montclair State University in Upper Montclair, N.J. Dr. Pennington was recently appointed by the U.S. Department of Education to serve a three-year term as a member of the Review Group of the Higher Education Center for Alcohol, Drugs and Violence Prevention.

Mr. Sabatino '76 received the award for law. Mr. Sabatino's practice includes legal counsel related to labor law and employee benefits. He is a regular speaker at conferences sponsored by the International Foundation of Employee Benefits and has lectured at the Comey Institute of Industrial

Relations at St. Joseph's University since 1984. He has also endowed the Charles V. Sabatino Sr. Scholarship at the University.

Mr. Mesko '56 received the award for management. During his college career at the University, Mr. Mesko began operating

Mesko Glass. In the 52 years that followed, he and his wife, Barbara, turned the family business into a major regional operation. In 1986, Mr. Mesko distinguished himself as "Small Business Man of the Year for Lackawanna County and Pennsylvania."

Communication Students Participate in NSAC Competition

What do you know about DaimlerChrysler? This was the question that Communication majors were asked to answer as they made their first appearance at the American Advertising Federation's National Student Advertising Competition.

Fifteen students from the University traveled to the World Trade Center in New York City, 27 and 28 April to make their debut for the District Two round of the National Student Advertising Competition (NSAC).

The American Advertising Federation (AAF) holds this national competition to give students an opportunity to create and present a campaign to a real-life client. Each year the competition is sponsored by a different corporation, which provides all schools with the same case study. The DaimlerChrysler Corporation, a global automotive manufacturer, sponsored this year's event.

The assignment was given to 30 students enrolled in the University's Advertising Practicum class at the beginning of the spring semester. Students were responsible for organizing themselves into groups to begin research on the global corporation. Aside from research, each group was responsible for additional input to the campaign. The teams designed imaginative and original public relations and promotional events to coincide with the class's new tag line for

DaimlerChrysler. Class members also selected appropriate media outlets, such as magazines, newspapers, television and the Internet for their campaign. All plans were required to adhere to the allotted budget from the DaimlerChrysler Corporation.

The competition required participating schools to submit 40-page plans books detailing the final campaign to their respective district coordinator and to the AAF headquarters in Washington, D.C. The team was also required to prepare a 20-minute presentation to summarize the final campaign. The presentation team consisted of five students selected from the University's advertising class. This year's presenters were Geoffrey Celis '02, Staten Island, N.Y.; Erin McGreevy '02, Hazlet, N.J.; Henry Rydecki '02, Trumbull, Conn.; Marshall Smith '02, Steep Falls, Maine; and Bridget Valente '01, Wallingford. The team was led by faculty advisor, Paula Rochon. Ms. Rochon, editor of *Happenings Magazine*, is an adjunct faculty member in the Communication Department.

The University's team competed with 18 other colleges and universities for a chance to go to the national round of the competition which was held 11 June in Cleveland, Ohio. Participating colleges included Ithaca College, Penn State, Georgetown University, Loyola College, Marist College, Hofstra University and Baruch College.

Campus Doesn't Close Down During Summer

Conferences, youth programs and personal enrichment classes, as well as for-credit courses offered at both the undergraduate and graduate level, will continue throughout the summer at the University. Sessions will range from personal enrichment and computer training classes to programs for elementary-age children and elderhostel classes for senior citizens.

"The campus does not close down during the summer," said Shirley Adams, Ph.D., Dean of Dexter Hanley College at the University. "As many of our students return to their homes, students who attend other institutions return to this area. Many will take classes at the University."

To date, 893 students from 19 universities have registered to take courses at the University this summer.

The University will also offer six Web-based classes during the summer.

"The Internet classes will give our resident students a chance to return home for the summer and still take a class at The University of Scranton," said Dean Adams.

On-line classes offered are Principles of Management, Micro Human Resources, Introduction to Criminal Justice, Computer Literacy, Women's Health and Health Writing for Publication.

In addition, over the summer, the University will offer arts-based enrichment

programs tailored to students in 6th through 12th grades. Programs include "Creative Me" for 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students; Time Travelers for high-achieving 6th through 8th grade students; Nurse Camp for 6th through 8th grade students; Arts Alive for 9th through 12th grades students; and the High School Scholars Program, which allows sophomore and junior high school students with a B+ or better grade-point average to take college-level courses. The National Youth Sports program will also run at the University from 18 June to 20 July.

The University's Center for Continuing Education will also offer numerous computer-training and computer-certificate programs, as well as other professional development programs over the summer months.

In addition, the University will host 32 conferences during the summer including the Victim Assistance Academy from 24 - 29 June; The Diocese of Scranton Youth Rally on 31 July; the Catholic Charismatics Conference from 3 - 5 August; and the National Railroad Historical Society on 18 August.

Orientation sessions for incoming students and their parents will be held on 27 and 28 June; 7 and 8 July; 11 and 12 July; and 14 and 15 July.

The registration deadline for the summer sessions varies according to start-date. Undergraduate and graduate courses will meet two or three times per week. The classes will be offered during three class sessions: from 30 May to 29 June; from 28 June to 27 July; or from 9 July through 8 August. Continuing education classes and youth summer programs have separate time schedules.

Center Provides Forum for Discussion of Ethics Issues

One year after its formation, the Center for Ethics Studies at the University has become a forum in which the central questions of human life and community have been discussed and debated.

The Center was established in March 2000 through a grant from the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute (NRCI) as part of the institute's ongoing educational programs on contemporary medicine and its moral implications. The five-year funding provided by NRCI is part of a larger grant from the U.S. Department of Energy.

"The mapping of the human genome has raised serious concerns regarding the legal, ethical and social implications of genetic links to cancer," said NRCI President Susan S. Belin. "We at NRCI are pleased to have the opportunity to partner with the Center for Ethics Studies to address the ramifications of those issues for people in our community."

During its first year, the Center concentrated its efforts in three related areas.

First, the Center worked to open a public forum in which the sustaining institutions of community life such as church, university, medicine or the law can publicly consider their relation with one another and to the larger common good.

To this end, a distinguished public lecture series has brought Internationally known scholars and ethicists to campus. These individuals have been invited to deliver public lectures at dinners with University and community leaders. Martin Marty, Ph.D., distinguished American Church historian, inaugurated the series in March 2000 with a lecture entitled "Being Catholic and Being 'catholic': Ethics in a Pluralist Society." This March, Jean Bethke Elshtain, political ethicist and feminist, spoke on the topic "Rules of Engagement: When Christians Engage the Public Realm."

Second, the Center encourages dialogue within the University community about moral matters, as well as the multi-disciplinary inquiry concerning broadly human concerns. The Center has facilitated ongoing faculty discussions or reading groups that provide an opportunity for the

exchange of ideas. Janice Voltzow, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Biology, presented a lecture on the relationship among science, genetics and ethics. Fr. Emmanuel Katongole, former Assistant Professor of Theology at Scranton and current Assistant Professor of Theology, Duke University, delivered a lecture on African history, violence and the legacy of Idi Amin.

Third, the Center has worked to promote scholarly reflection and exchange about ethics-related issues, including ethics and genetics, and ethics and technology. A national conference was held on campus in April, drawing ten eminent scholars from around the country to discuss "Genetic Engineering and the Future of Human Nature."

Looking ahead, the Center for Ethics Studies hopes to continue its activities in all three program areas. Among the activities planned are a second conference on genetic engineering, a third distinguished public lecturer, a fall forum for community lawyers on the good practice of law and various other on-campus lectures and discussions.

The tenth annual Senior Student-Athlete Banquet was held on 4 May at the John J. Long, S.J., Center. Highlighting the evening's festivities was the presentation of the O'Hara, Fitzpatrick and Willensky awards.

Amy Connolly (Cherry Hills, N.J./Camden Catholic), Sarah Gazdalski (Wharton, N.J./Pope John Paul XXIII) and Joseph Fent (Dalton/Scranton Prep) received the 2001 Frank O'Hara awards, which are presented annually to the top male and female athletes of the senior class. The awards are named in honor of the late Frank O'Hara, a 1925 Scranton graduate who had a distinguished career for more than 50 years in a variety of roles at the University.

Receiving the second-ever Father Fitzpatrick awards were Kelly Pippet (Churchville/Nazar eth Academy) and Bryan Ruda (Bloomsburg/Central Columbia). Named in honor of the late Reverend John J. Fitzpatrick, S.J., long-time friend and counselor of Royal student-athletes, these awards are granted to the student-athletes who have demonstrated outstanding leadership and who have given extraordinary service and contributions to the University community and to society in general.

Nicole Bayman (Long Valley, N.J./West Morris Central) was selected the recipient of the 2001 Ron Willensky Award, which is presented to the senior student-athlete who consistently undertakes to understand and improve the human condition. The award is named in honor of Ron Willensky, a native of Scranton and a 1963 graduate of the University who was a lifelong fan of the Royals and Lady Royals.

Connolly, a four-year starter and the second all-time leading scorer in the women's soccer program, is the only player in the history of the program to earn National Soccer Coaches Association of

America (NSCAA) all-Mid-Atlantic regional honors for four consecutive years.

Gazdalski, a four-year letter-winner in women's swimming, was an NCAA Division III qualifier in 1999, where she earned all-America honors in the 200-yard backstroke, and again in 2001. An 11-time Middle Atlantic Conference champion, she was twice named the recipient of the David E. Eavenson Award (1998, 2000), which is presented to the outstanding swimmer of the MAC championships. Outstanding in the classroom, she was named the 2001 Middle Atlantic Conference Female Scholar-Athlete for winter sports and was a first-team Verizon Academic all-American. She earned third-team honors one year ago.

Fent, a four-year letterman on the cross country team, was a two-time NCAA Division III all-American. A three-time NCAA qualifier (1998, 1999, 2000), Fent is only the second runner in the history of the Middle Atlantic Conference to win four consecutive individual league titles.

Like Gazdalski, Fent also saved his best performances for the classroom. He was named the recipient of the first-ever MAC men's scholar-athlete for fall sports and was twice named to a national academic all-America team. He is also one of only 58 student-athletes from across all three divisions of the NCAA to earn a prestigious post-graduate scholarship.

Pippet, a four-year letter-winner on the women's swim team, competed in three events at the 2000 and 2001 Middle Atlantic Conference championships.

Her biggest contributions, however, came outside the swimming pool. She did an internship at a local elementary school, working with individuals and groups in a school counseling setting, where she taught students about diversity, disabilities and conflict management. She also worked as a counselor with students at East Stroudsburg's Notre Dame High School. She was a member of the Human Service Association on campus, which administered programs such as the Turkey Drive, Hand-in-Hand and the Easter Egg Hunt for underprivileged children. She also found time to be a peer educator in the Sexual Assault Response Team and was a member of the Best Buddies Program and the Student-Athlete Committee.

Ruda, a four-year letterman on the men's swim team, also made his biggest splash outside the pool. He was student director of publicity for Campus Ministry; served as a research assistant to Dr. David Marx, head of the chemistry department; and was a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Board. He was co-director of "Boo at the Zoo" and "Spring Fling-Scrantonpalooza" for Student Life and Leadership.

During Spring Break, he worked with community groups such as the United Neighborhood Center, Boys & Girls Club of Scranton, Taylor Library and Meals-on-Wheels. He also participated in a Senior Service trip to Boston, where he worked with the Boston Housing Authority at a soup kitchen for women. He was also a member of the University's Symphonic Band and Music Ministry and the Commuter and Off-Campus Association.

Bayman, a three-year letter-winner on the women's soccer team, overcame a physical disability that left her with vision in only one eye. Her disability did not prevent her from becoming an all-American, both on the playing field and in the classroom.

This past fall, she led Scranton to a 17-4-1 overall record, which included a Freedom Conference championship and a berth in the NCAA Division III tournament. She was named the 2000 Freedom Conference Player of the Year, was selected second-team all-American by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and finished her career as the eighth all-time leading scorer in Scranton history.

Bayman joined Gazdalski as a first-team selection to the 2001 Verizon Academic all-America team. Like Fent, she has been granted a prestigious NCAA post-graduate scholarship.

Senior catcher **Ryan Matlosz (Cranford, N.J./Cranford)** was named second-team all-Freedom Conference after finishing second on the team in batting with a .360 average. He led the Royals in hits (36), runs batted in (20) and total bases (49) and tied for the team-lead in doubles (5) and home runs (2).

McPherson finished her outstanding season by being ranked in the league in nine statistical categories. A 16-game hitting streak raised her batting average to .429, third on the team behind Miller, who led the team with a .464 average, and freshman pitcher **Sarah Rhodes (Short Hills, N.J./Millburn)**. Miller was also ranked in a number of Freedom Conference statistical categories this year, including hitting (2nd), on-base percentage (8th), runs scored (9th) and hits (11th).
