Deceased students that did not graduate have been removed from the cohorts.

Enrollment data is as of October 1st.

Graduation data is as of August 31st.

Students that are studying abroad as of the fall census date are now included in retention figures.

Data beginning in 2010 are calculated using the revised HEOA coding requirements, which also includes a 'two or more races' category. All ethnic and race data is self-reported.
