### ***Additional Information: Teacher Certification in SLP***

Some SLP students may be interested in working with children in an educational institution. Along with ASHA certification and state licensure, some states require teaching certification. Teacher certification is separate from state licensure and national certification. Teacher certification requirements are determined by each state and vary by state. ***Currently, the University of Scranton's SLP program is not designed to prepare students for this unique type of certification in all states.*** Students interested in pursuing state specific teacher certification should review curricular and other requirements for teacher certification in any state they are interested in seeking certification as they consider their career plans.
