

Communication

Clearly & effectively exchange information, ideas, facts, and perspectives with persons.

Critical Understanding

The ability to make sound judgements in complex and changing environments.



Critical Thinking

Identify and respond to needs based on an understanding of situational context and logical analysis of relevant information.

Technology *Understand and leverage technologies*

Understand and leverage technologies ethically to complete tasks and accomplish goals.

Cura Personalis

Recognition of the value and dignity of the whole person, emphasizing the needs of each individual, encompassing their intellectual, emotional, spiritual, and physical well-being.

CONNECT SYLLABUS THE DOTS LANGUAGE

One way to highlight the skills and competencies students are developing in your courses is to outline this information in your syllabus.

*Explicitly highlighting this language for students will help them better understand how what they are learning connects to their future opportunities. Students can use this information to build resume bullets, answer questions in interviews, and complete graduate applications.

Not all competencies may be applicable in each course; however, below are language examples that you can modify.

COMMUNICATION

"This course will build your verbal communication skills through regular discussions on assigned readings. You will also have a presentation where you will share your research or topic with the class. In addition, you will also develop written communication skills through written assignments in both short essays and a final research paper."

TEAMWORK

"This course will build your teamwork skills through various small group activities which will task you with working effectively toward a common goal and working collaboratively on the topic or project assigned."

CRITICAL THINKING

"This course will strengthen your critical thinking skills through exposure to a wide range of sources and concepts that will enable you to better understand and analyze issues and problems. These skills will be practiced through both your regular written work, papers, and our class discussions and small group activities."

CONNECT SYLLABUS THE DOTS LANGUAGE

TECHNOLOGY

"This course will enable you to leverage technology in order to contribute to class assignments. You will learn to navigate an online database to find and present information in a final research paper."

LEADERSHIP


"This course will allow for group projects where leadership skills will be strengthened. The project will require students to take initiative on a topic and communicate with other group members and the faculty member throughout the duration of the assignment."

PROFESSIONALISM

"Students will be accountable for attending class each week, showing up on time, and handing in assignments in a timely manner according to the syllabus. Students will be responsible for communicating to the faculty member of any circumstances preventing them to do so. If late, not in attendance, or missing assignments repeatedly, points will be deducted. This accountability develops professionalism for the workplace."

CAREER & SELF DEVELOPMENT

"This course is intended to help students develop their interests within the field and explore their options within those interests. Students are encouraged to seek out more information and guidance to aid in this process."
