



SELF-GUIDED TOUR

- 1 **The Office of Admissions** is located in the Estate, the former home of the Scranton family.
- 2 **The Loyola Science Center** features 22 class and seminar rooms, 34 laboratories and a multi-story atrium.
- 3 **St. Thomas Hall** houses the departments of Theology/Religious Studies, Philosophy, History and Communication. The Communications Wing features a fully equipped television studio with editing facilities and the broadcast studios of our radio station, WUSR-FM 99.5.
- 4 **The John J. Long, S.J., Center** provides indoor athletic facilities for our intercollegiate and intramural teams, and houses the department of Athletics.
- 5 **The William J. Byron, S.J., Recreation Complex** is home to our intramural sports program and includes three full-sized, multi-purpose courts, six-lane pool, dance/aerobics room, four racquetball courts and wrestling room.
- 6 **Sophomore residences** include **John R. Gavigan, Francis E. Redington** and **Christopher & Margaret Condron Halls**. The University offers 35 buildings that serve as on-campus housing; University housing is guaranteed for four consecutive years.

- 7 The 13 **freshman residence halls** on campus are **Casey, Denis-Edward, Driscoll, Fitch, Gannon, Giblin-Kelly, Hafey, Lavis, Lynett, MacKillop, Martin, McCourt, and Nevils**. The halls allow freshmen to interact with each other in close proximity. The outdoor courtyard, known as the Freshman Patio, allows for activities such as watching movies, throwing a frisbee or just lounging.
- 8 **The Patrick & Margaret DeNaples Center** is the central hub for the campus community. It includes a ballroom, fireplace lounge, theatre, bookstore and retail dining, as well as the Center for Student Engagement, Campus Ministries and the Student Forum, a central location for student organizations.
- 9 The 197,000-sq.-ft. complex, **Pilarz & Montrone Halls**, features apartments for 400 juniors and seniors, a fitness complex and a dining area.
- 10 **The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Memorial Library** offers 726,863 books, 60,759 journals in print and online, 24/7 chat reference assistance, 94 computer workstations, numerous laptops and iPads for loan and a café.
- 11 **The McDade Center for Literary & Performing Arts** includes a "black box" studio theatre, the 300-seat Royal Theatre, classrooms, a writing laboratory and offices for the English and Theatre Departments.

- 12 **Brennan Hall** features the latest high-technology teaching equipment for the AACSB-accredited Kania School of Management, including the departments of Accounting, Economics/Finance, Management/Marketing and Operations and Information Management. It also includes the Alperin Financial Center which simulates a "trading floor" environment, complete with an electronic ticker, and news and data displays.
- 13 **The Edward R. Leahy Jr. Hall** houses the departments of exercise science, occupational therapy and physical therapy. It features 25 state-of-the-art laboratories, nine traditional and active-learning classrooms, nine group study rooms, 56 faculty offices, multiple simulation environments and an Einstein Bros. Bagels.

OTHER AREAS OF NOTE

- 14 **O'Hara Hall** houses the departments of World Languages and Cultures, Political Science and Sociology/Criminal Justice.
- 15 **Hyland Hall** includes classrooms and the Hope Horn Gallery.
- 16 **McGurrian Hall** houses classrooms and laboratories for Counseling and Human Services, Education, Health Administration, Human Resources and Nursing. It is also home to the Leahy Community Health and Family Center, which allows students to learn while serving unmet needs in the community.
- 17 **Houlihan-McLean Center** contains rehearsal and performance space for Performance Music ensembles and concert offerings.

- 18 **Romero Plaza** and **Madison Square** provide apartment-style living for upperclass students.
- 19 The University's primary chapel, **20 Madonna della Strada**, is located in **Rock Hall**, which also houses the Military Science Department.
- 21 **Ciszek Hall** accommodates the Gerard R. Roche Center for Career Development.
- 22 **Roche Wellness Center** houses Student Health Services.
- 23 **Alumni Memorial Hall** accommodates the Psychology Department and the Technology Support Center.
- 24 **Fitzpatrick Field** provides outdoor space for soccer, lacrosse and field hockey. Featuring lights and synthetic grass, it's also used for intramural and club sports.
- 25 **The Chapel of the Sacred Heart** is used for daily mass and confession.
- 26 **Scranton Hall** houses the Office of the President.
- 27 **Campion Hall** serves as a residence for the Scranton Jesuit community.
- 28 **The Quinn Athletics Campus** is home to the baseball, field hockey, lacrosse, soccer and softball teams that compete at the NCAA Division III level. All three fields – Magis Field, Weiss Field and Volpe Field – feature lights and synthetic grass.
- 29 **The Gail & Francis Slattery Center for Humanities** advances the University's liberal arts tradition and enhances the core role it plays in the formation of students to become "men and women for and with others."
